We're Still Growing

At last count, there are over 210 active members, and over 823 "followers" on our Face-Book site. Google reports over a couple hundred visitors to our main website per week.

We're pretty sure that makes us one of the largest Jeep Clubs in the state! Maybe even the largest but — hey, this isn't a competition.

What really matters is our level of activity. Even in spite of the chaotic weather, ranging from oven hot to torrential flash storms — we managed to keep adding trail runs to our calendar.

Now that the weather has settled down, along with cooler temperatures — expect even more trail fun to be scheduled.

Some of our current Mid & Tail Gunners will soon be leading our easier trails on their own, in addition to our main core of Trail Leaders.

We expect to have at least 2 or 3 Beginners 101 Training Runs per month (such as Mt Potosi, Kodachrome, Aztec, Mormon, etc); as well as some more advanced wheeling (Wheelers Pass, 13 Mile Loop, etc). Mix in a little Overlanding as well. The cooler temperatures also mean more time on the trails to enjoy the natural surroundings. A chance to explore, or sit around and picnic; not just a mad dash in and out.

Runs will continue to be held on weekdays as well as weekends, to accommodate different schedules. Days and trails are chosen based on the preference and availability of the Trail Leaders.

Desert Wranglers always needs more Trail Leaders. Volunteer to be a Mid or Tail Gunner; there are always experienced drivers on the run who can assist you in a difficult situation, so go ahead and try it out! That's how you learn.

Desert Wranglers Trail Master Notes by Jim Taylor



If you are a member of this club, you probably enjoy going off road in your Jeep. If you have been off road and enjoyed the experience, it is natural to feel like you would like to share the experience.

Most Jeeps have more than one passenger seat. It all works. Sometimes we take a spouse, sometimes a friend, and **sometimes** we take our dog.

Whoever we take, we need to be responsible and prepare them for the environment that they are going to be confronted with.

The desert can be a hostile and unforgiving place. The ride can be rough and the conditions extreme. We also need to be sure that there is ample food, water and emergency equipment for all members on the trip in case of a breakdown or delay or other unforeseen situation.

This is not a trip to the local grocery store. We may be taking the same vehicle as we do to get the groceries, but the planning needs to be totally different. We need to have "our heads in the game".

Our guests likewise need to be fully engaged and be prepared to deal with the desert environment.

We also need to be sure our pets are prepared to deal with the uncomfortable motion and the proximity of other people and pets on the run when we stop.

Pets need to be leashed, *don't try that with your spouse. My experience is that they are not as understanding as dogs.*

Should your dog wander off on its own, exploring the natural surroundings — we don't want to spend the day searching. Leashes are mandatory!

We also need to be sure that our guests are prepared for the social environment and that we look out for their welfare. If your furry friends are uncomfortable around new people or children — they should be prepared to stay in the Jeep. If your dog is aggressive and threatening around new people or new animals, he/she needs to stay at home and guard the house. We all have our roles to play.



The desert can be a place of beauty and inspiration. To master the art of off-road driving can be personally rewarding. We need to allow ourselves and our fellow travelers the opportunity to take it all in without being distracted by the less positive aspects of human or canine behaviors.

Have fun out there. I will see you all out on the trail.



Desert Tortoises store all the water they need. If touched or picked up they evacuate all that water which puts them in danger.

It is illegal to remove a desert tortoise from the wild. Unless you have a special



permit, no one is allowed to own, touch, harm, harass, disturb or pick up a wild desert tortoise or disturb their burrows.

If you see a desert tortoise in the wild or in an undeveloped area, do not touch them or disturb them, but please do enjoy watching them from a safe distance.

Tortoise facts:

Lifespan - 50 years in wild/80-100 in Captivity

Length - 7 to 13 inches

Weight - 8 to 15 pounds

Range: The Mojave desert tortoise occurs in the Mojave and Colorado deserts north and west of the Colorado River in southwestern Utah, southern Nevada, southeastern California, and northwestern Arizona in the United States


Minden Nevada October 12-14 at the Carson Valley Inn. This is a free event to attend and sign-ups will be through this page starting June 1st.

Desert Wranglers Trail Badges

Eric Nix, our esteemed Asst Webmaster, is a person of many talents. He came up with the idea of producing a series of official Desert Wranglers Trail Badges that members could collect to commem-



orate their first completion of our club runs.

Eric not only proposed these unique badges, but using his high tech garage toys — he is manufacturing them in his spare time for the club, and it is only costing us materials.

At first glance, you might be reminded of other Jeep Badges, but these are distinctly different and are specific to our club.

There are other clubs and events around the country who also award badges, so we are not the only ones who do this.

To qualify for a particular badge, you must have participated on a recent (2022) club run. We have the waivers, remember, so we can verify. Having run the trail in the past before we reorganized, or with other groups, does not count.

Trail Leaders will present badges at the conclusion (air-up) of their runs. We are asking for a five dollar donation to cover costs. Only one badge per first time on that trail, per Jeep.

Going off-road for the first time is a rite of passage. To mark the successful completion of their first, **Beginners 101 Training Run** (such as Mt Potosi or Kodachrome) — the Trail Leaders will present our new off-roaders with their first badge at no charge.



If you have completed one of our Desert Wrangler trail runs recently, and want to purchase a badge, then you need to contact the Trail Leader of that past run to order your badge. Upon verification, arrangements will be made for you to claim your badge at a general meeting or a future trail run.

You can also view our Educational videos, members' channels, and links to sponsored materials.



From our webmaster... What's New on the www.desertwranglers.club website



Club Treasury

Dues subscription payments continue to be automatically transferred each day into the checking account. We currently have 207 paid members as of noon today.

The America First Credit Union has sent us a set of properly printed checks.

All of our financial accounts have been entered into Quicken 2022 Deluxe and have been reconciled as of September 12, 2022.

Sales profits of \$89.21 have been generated on the Spring Merchandise store.

I have kept the club's proceeds from last month's Split-the-Pot sales as petty cash, to facilitate the sales of Split-the-Pot tickets at our meetings.

We have approximate assets of \$5500. in checking and cash.

The club owes approximately \$1350. in Founders Loans (Board members footed our start-up expenses out of pocket).

Net worth is around \$4150.

(This is just a synapsis; detailed accounting is regularly provided to the Board.)

We don't anticipate the next major cycle of dues until next June, so we are being very conservative with our fiscal spending. Many of our operating costs are recurring, and we cannot be certain at this time if everyone will renew their memberships.

We are in the process of ratifying our 2023 budget, and will report on that soon.

Examples of our Operating Expenses

One of the most frequently asked questions is "Where does our dues money go?"

No one in this club receives any salary nor material perk. No reimbursements for gas, meals, or anything of value.

It takes money to start-up and maintain an organization, even though we are a 501c3 non-profit (application fees, filing fees, annual fees). The website entails domain and hosting fees. Meetup charges us. Our UPS street mailbox (required by the state) is an expense. Banking and software fees. Door prizes (when not donated). Monies for the BBQ event and Holiday Party.

And that is only the top of the list. In today's world, everything comes with a price — no matter how altruistic our intentions.

Off Road 101 Training Classes

One of our mission goals, as a charitable and educational non-profit organization (501c3) is to introduce and train beginners about safe off-roading.

To that end, we have a library of educational articles and videos. We conduct educational discussions at our meetings.

We routinely conduct Beginners 101 Training runs (such as Mt Potosi and Kodachrome) designed to provide a fun and confidence building experience for first timers.

Next year, we are hoping to offer in-person and/or online introductory lectures about off-road basics, so that people new to Jeeping can get an overview of equipment and procedures, especially before they hit the trails for their first time.

These sorts of classes are offered by other clubs all around the country. For instance, Dixie4WD in St. George schedules them monthly; and at Winter 4x4.

In addition to doing these classes a few times per year, we also want to provide some hands-on classes on winching & recovery.



SNORR puts on excellent overview classes, which we strongly recommend, but there is still a need to actually deploy your winch and practice with it.

Understand that belonging to our Facebook group is not tied to actual club membership. FB serves as a Forum for discussion threads, announcements, general posts. It is pretty much open to the public — which is why we do not post specific details of club events.

How to Join Desert Wranglers



Joining Desert Wranglers is easy. First though, you gotta drive a Jeep Wrangler or JT.

Unlike some clubs, we welcome newbies and offer mild to intermediate trail runs that are stock friendly.



Go to our website www.desertwranglers.club and click on the JOIN button. Answer the questionnaire and then you will be taken to a page where you can submit your \$25 annual dues. Note, that is per Jeep — so it includes driver, co-driver, and passengers.

There is one more important step. After joining Desert Wranglers, you still need to join on our **Meetup** group. *There is a link on the website to facilitate this step.*



Meetup is where we post the private details about club runs & events, and how active members can RSVP.

Although much of Meetup is accessible to the public, unless you are an approved Member of Desert Wranglers — critical details and meeting information are kept private. Also, you would not be able to RSVP to attend an event, nor be placed on the Wait List.

And a chance for the adults to hang out together, share some pot luck tailgate grub, and not act their age for a night.




