
Where did we go?

LAKE MOJAVE

TIPS AND TRICKS



Airing Down/Up can be a pain (in the back), what with screwing/unscrewing those finely threaded deflator valves or the connection on your air hose. An inexpensive and easier solution is to purchase some speed chucks on Amazon or your local parts place, and attach them to your deflators and hoses. Now, instead of struggling to line up those threads and screw around (literally) for dozens of twists – you only have to slide the chuck over your tire stem

and flick the lock with your finger. Easy on / Easy off.


Spring Mountains NRA CLOSED Until Further Notice!

The use of our Meetup event platform as proved to be a great fit for our club and we seem to have worked out any bugs in our sign up process and the conversion from the old account to the new account.

The RSVP feature, and the ability to limit the number of Jeeps that can participate in a particular event, has allowed us to remain organized, safe, compliant, and everyone enjoying the trails. Since we do have limits, it's important to RSVP only for runs you will attend. If things change please edit your RSVP to "not going" asap.

Also, get on the wait list if a run is full. Changes happen a lot, even the entire roster flips from original RSVP'ers to those that showed up, so there's a good chance you'll get to go!






